- Format:** Tabloids (point for trying. Competitors will have to qualify with first attempt)

In terms of other events like the triple jump, 400m and javelin, any student who wishes to compete in these events at the PDSSSC level will need to see Mr Whiley for all the details.

All tabloids have 45 minutes to complete the rotation and that necessitates the qualifying standards in field events. If students are obviously good enough to reach the standard but foul on the first attempt, they will be given subsequent attempts, except in High Jump. In High Jump, a foul on the first attempt will lead to elimination. Once a student qualifies for high jump, they will have one chance to foul until there are 3 to 4 students remaining. Once there are 3 students remaining, they will be given the full 3 attempts but only if there is sufficient time remaining.
